



TRAINING FOR FAMILIES, YOUTH AND PROVIDERS “What’s After High School?” - Training on Transition

“What’s After High School?” is a broad overview of the transition to adult life for young adults with disabilities and special needs and includes the following topics: thinking about a young adult’s future; the role of schools; long-term supports; vocational resources; moving into adult health care; guardianship and other legal options; advocacy; and the basics of self-determination.

This training is ideal for families who have youth age 14 – 21 and providers and school staff who work with young adults with special needs. *Youth are encouraged to attend!* The training is free. A light meal and a resource binder will be provided.
