Informational Update on Technical Education Facility Planning

- Eric Burke, Superintendent, stated that tours of both new and remodeled facilities have taken place.
- Meetings with community partner update:
 - o Next meeting dates are May 10 and May 17, 2023.
 - o Meetings continue with Lab Midwest and Nicolet College.
 - To determine costs, decisions need to be made on equipment that must be included vs equipment wanted.
- Both Rhinelander High School and James Williams Middle School facilities need upgrading.
- Dr. Swank will pledge \$500,000.00 for equipment for this project.
- In June, Administration will provide an updated report to the School Board and ask the

Board regarding surveying the community to determine what the community wants to

- The survey needs to be done correctly to determine support. It is essential to be excellent stewards of our resources.
- The community needs a clear understanding of why this is being proposed.
- It is essential to remember that the equipment is part of the project and is separate from the facilities/buildings.

Informational Update on Maintenance Building and Crescent Playground

- Bob Thom, Director of Business, updated the Committee on possibly constructing a maintenance building.
- The City of Rhinelander and DNR have approved the proposed building site.
- A building design would need to be completed to obtain cost estimates.
- We have the needed permits from the City of Rhinelander and the required wetland permits from the DNR.
- Fill from the possible Crescent playground expansion would be used at the proposed site, resulting in a possible savings of \$22,000.00.
