EDUCATION FAIR

Juniors and seniors interested in learning more about post-secondary opportunities are encouraged to attend the annual **Education Fair** on **Thursday, October 10, 2019 at Northland Pines High School, 9:00-11:00am**. Students will travel by bus.

Representatives from Wisconsin, Minnesota and Michigan for 2 year, 4 year, public and private schools, as well as all branches of the military, will be available to speak with and offer students insight about opportunities. Financial aid information will also be available. The purpose of the fair is to help students explore opportunities by receiving more specific information from the representatives.

Students may sign up and get permission form in Student Services, beginning September 23rd. Permission slips are due in Student Services by Friday, October 4th.

TRANSCRIPTS

Rhineland High School utilizes Parchment for transcripts. It provides students with the convenience of ordering transcripts online. Transcripts may be requested by juniors and seniors at no cost.

In order to access Parchment, students will need to stop in Student Services to obtain directions and a registration code.

ACCUPLACER AND TEST PREP

The Accuplacer provides a student with useful information about academic skills in math, English, and reading. The results are used by technical colleges, such as Nicolet Area Technical College to help determine course placement.

The Accuplacer test will be held at Nicolet College on Wednesday, October 30th. Transportation will be provided by RHS. There is no cost for the test to students provided they also take the test prep through a Nicolet representative.

ASVAB

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) is a multiple-aptitude test developed and maintained by the Department of Defense. Part of the ASVAB entails Career Exploration, helping students to identify and explore potentially satisfying occupations and develop effective strategies to achieve career goals.

The ASVAB test is available to students in grades 11 and 12 at RHS on Thursday, September 26th, 7:55-11:00 am. There is no cost for the test. Please sign up in Student Services office by September 23rd.

Test results are not shared with military recruiting services unless you desire to have your scores used for enlistment eligibility.



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COLLEGE VISITS

Throughout the year, representatives from various colleges and military services visit Rhineland High School to reach out to students who want to pursue a postsecondary education, as well as talk one-on-one with the students about what their school/program has to offer.

The representatives are available in the cafeteria to talk with students during lunch shifts or may visit during the Flex period time frame.

PSAT/NMSQT

The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test will be available to interested students at Rhineland High School on Wednesday, October 16th, 7:55-12

It is optional for sophomores and juniors. If a student is planning on taking the SAT, the PSAT is a "practice" SAT. The NMSQT serves as an initial screen of approximately 1.5 million juniors each year who score exceptionally well. The top 1% of the 1.5 million juniors may gain entry into scholarship competitions and recognition programs sponsored by the National Merit Corporation.

Sign up begins September 23rd in Student Services. \$17 cash/ check payable to Rhineland High School is due upon sign up.
